The Rector's Message

“The Seven Weeks of Easter”

We're familiar with the forty days of Lent and those special days during Holy Week: Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Lent is a time of penitence and preparation and Holy Week a time to travel into Jerusalem with Christ and his disciples and face what waits there. Holy Week moves from Hosannas and waving palms as we enter Jerusalem with Jesus on Palm Sunday to an upper room where feet are washed in a memorable act of service by the King of kings and a simple meal is shared. Then we find ourselves standing beneath a wooden cross on a dirt packed hillside (or in hiding) and following at a distance (or not at all) towards a dark tomb that is sealed by rock.

The sun rises on Easter Morning. We find the tomb empty. Year after year, we link the empty tomb with the conclusion that “He is risen!” We know and love Easter Day, the day of resurrection, the day of new life. “He is risen,” we sing, with joy in our hearts, sensing that this has meaning for our lives too.

But, we seem less aware of the fact that Easter doesn't stop at sundown on Easter Sunday. Our liturgical year provides us seven weeks of Easter. We continue to celebrate Easter for six more Sundays – up to the Day of Pentecost.

This Easter time – all seven weeks of it – is essential to our understanding of the Easter event. It is a time of confirmation (that Christ has risen) and a time of preparation (to receive the Holy Spirit) and then commission (to go forth into the world).

During these Sundays in the Easter cycle Jesus appears to his disciples, confirming that he has risen, that he lives. During these Sundays we hear again some basic truths about how we are to live together with each other, how we are to live in relationship with the Divine (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) and then in relationship with the world.

Father and Son are One. The Holy Spirit, the great Advocate, is coming. Jesus continues his teaching during this post-resurrection period. On the Day of Pentecost, what Jesus has taught is seen as truth as the disciples are filled with the Holy Spirit. They are emboldened and energized to go out into the world – to preach, teach, baptize, making Christ and Divine Love known in the world.

As Christians, as Christ followers, we are called to do likewise during this Easter time and beyond.

I ask you to travel through this Easter period with awareness, with intentionality. So that you are ready to sense and experience the empowerment that awaits you at Pentecost. There is work to be done at St. Mary's Whitechapel and Trinity. There is work to be done in our local community. There is work to be done in the wider world. There is work to be done in our families, however you and God define “family” (nuclear, church, neighborhood, etc., etc.) – working from the inside on out to the world. We start on home ground and then are called by God to the wider circles in which we are a part.

Walk this Easter journey with joy and commitment as the path opens week by week to what it means to be a Christian, to be a disciple. As a suggestion, consider reading each week ahead of time the Gospel passage assigned to the upcoming Sunday. Reflect on it and ask some questions of yourself and the passage. What is being said in this passage? What can I identify with in this passage? What is being asked of me (like the early disciples)? What challenges me? What gives me hope? What do I need to happen in my life to be open to the power and promise of connection and love with the Divine?

“Traveling Through Eastertime with the Scriptures”

The Gospel readings for the seven weeks following Easter Sunday:

April 11 (Second Sunday of Easter) John 20:19-31

Jesus appears to his disciples who are in hiding. He responds to “doubting” Thomas.

April 18 (Third Sunday of Easter) John 21:1-19

After a big fishing trip by the Sea of Tiberias, Jesus and the disciples have breakfast on the beach. Jesus and Peter talk about love, feeding lambs and tending sheep.

April 25 (Fourth Sunday of Easter) John 10:22-30

Jesus talks about his sheep – the ones who hear his voice and follow. And what that means for the sheep.

May 2 (Fifth Sunday of Easter) John 13:31-35

Jesus gives a new commandment: “Love one another just as I have loved you. . . . By this everyone will know that you are my disciples.”

May 9 (Sixth Sunday of Easter) John 14:23-29

Jesus gives advance notice to the disciples about the coming of the Holy Spirit and what this means in their lives.

May 16 (Seventh Sunday of Easter) John 17:20-26 or John 5:1-9

Alternative passages are offered. In John 17, Jesus prays for his disciples. In John 5, Jesus asks a man lying beside the pool at the Sheep Gate, “Do you want to be made well?”

Church Repairs & Restoration

Get out your hard hats. The work is about to begin. No, seriously, you won't need hard hats because we're forewarning you not to get too close to the action. And any "sidewalk" supervision you may feel compelled to offer, restrain yourself or do it non-verbally from a distance.

Here's the anticipated schedule:

- 1) Tree work in April (after Easter);
- 2) Removal of Bell Tower prior to tearing off the two roofs (late April to early May);
- 3) repair and restoration to the Bell Tower (May);
- 4) removal of the two (yes, two – the one you see and the old cedar shake roof underneath the one you see) roofs and placement of new roof (May).

Other work includes addition of some new insulation, patching and painting in the Parish Hall (June and beyond).

We anticipate holding services in the Parish Hall in May and getting back into the sanctuary in June. It's an exciting time. Every time you have a chance, please thank Craig Giese (Senior Warden) and Stanley James (Junior Warden) who are the planners, coordinators and overseers of all the work. A few "thank you's" and "it looks great" will continue to energize them.

The Townsend Fund

In 2007 The Rev. Morton Townsend gifted \$100,000 to Trinity Episcopal Church. Before he died he left no instructions as to how Trinity was to use his gift. The gift was placed with The Diocese of Virginia funds (where all of Trinity's invested funds are held).

At its meeting on March 29th the Vestry passed a Resolution regarding the gift. This was done after considerable conversation and deliberation. Wes Edwards was instrumental in assisting with appropriate language for the Resolution. Rev. Townsend's children graciously offered their input and shared with us what they understood and believed to be their father's wishes concerning the gift.

Following are some of the major points covered in the Resolution.

The Fund is named the Rev. Morton Townsend Fund. The purpose of the Fund is "to assure, maintain and enhance the presence of Trinity Episcopal Church in the community." The Fund is not to be used for the day to day operations of Trinity Episcopal Church. Examples of what it will not be used for include salaries, utilities, routine maintenance and other routine operating expenses. Examples of appropriate uses of the Fund include such types of projects as community oriented programs, capital improvements, acquisition of property, major grounds work, etc., etc. Use of the Fund may include use of principal, income and/or any future additions to the Fund, but must be consistent with the purposes of the Fund and any limitations set out in the Resolution.

If you would like to see a copy of the Resolution, please let the Rector or one of the Wardens know.

Child Care will be provided for parents during the service

During April the young people at Trinity will be celebrating the Sundays of Easter, by changing the colors on the altar to white with flowers from the purple of Lent.

Along with other whole parish family events during the month, there will be a Godly Play lesson on baptism near the Sunday when Emily Carlson will be baptized! "Holy Baptism is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into the Church. The rite draws both the past and future into the present, so there is no need to be baptized more than once.....It is the gateway into the family of families we call the Church, the primary moment in the life of a Christian person to be remembered and looked forward to."

We baptize in the traditional name of the Holy Trinity...so the lesson is presented on three overlapping white circles. "The names of Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer" are juxtaposed to the classical language to show that the Trinity is about much more than gender."

There is an action on each circle: "the pouring of water for the Creator, the lighting of the Christ Candle for the Redeemer, and the images of dove and the invisible scent of oil for the Sustainer. We remember or look forward to our own baptisms by lighting candles from the light of the Christ candle, since this is also the day they receive their "light." (Godly Play vol. 3, p. 70)

Stephanie Carlson or I will be the storyteller each Sunday. [We are collecting different shaped crosses to use for tracing and other art work especially after Easter.]
